The Advent Sundays traditionally have had readings associated with John the Baptist (the one who prepared the way), the Second Coming of Christ and Mary herself as she


180th Celebration

During the month of November there will be a Prayer Box in the Library Nook outside the Small Hall. Any prayer requests will be prayed for at this meeting.


